Will provide a bi-monthly gathering for church planters. Will work together with the Mission Team when the need arises.

**Revitalization Team** will identify plateaued and dying churches in the NBA. They will offer assistance to these churches by providing resources and training. They will also develop a process for churches to partner together. They will continue to develop the legacy church and repurposing method of revitalization.

# Executive Director

## **“The IT City,” The Other Coast, Music City, Nashville**

Our home and mission field is one of the fastest growing metro areas in the U.S. with a population of 1,875,000 people today and 2 million people by 2020. The 36<sup>th</sup> largest city in the U.S.

Barna Research tells us that only 20 percent of Nashville are totally committed Christians, and only 51 percent attend church weekly.

Your NBA Staff has been busy this past year helping churches bring Christ to a vital southern city that is mostly de-churched, self-absorbed and self-righteous.

### **Some things that we see working in growing NBA churches:**

1. Praying for lost family, friends, and neighbors by name every day
2. Training Church members how to share Christ with their family, friends and neighbors when God provides the opportunity.

**1** and **2** as a church-wide strategy

3. Service ministries to the local community near the church (schools, businesses, government servant employees)
4. Small groups that are discipleship in nature with a ministry expectation being a part of the group.
5. Churches serving together to impact their community in the name of Christ
6. Vibrant worship experiences where the people anticipate that God will do something and because of this, they are eager to invite their friends.
7. Churches have a plan to make an impact for Christ, and they are moving forward with the plan.
8. Churches  
As Henry Blackaby says, “God is working all around us, we must join Him where He is working.”
9. More than one church sharing the same building, many times sharing building costs and expenses.
10. Dying and plateaued churches strategically engaging in a revitalization process to develop plans for the future.

Nashville is a strategic city in the U.S. We Baptists must not surrender our city to Satan. God help us to overcome our complacency, apathy, fears, and worship of the past to move forward in reaching one city for Christ!

The Nashville Baptist Association has 180 churches that God calls His bride. He wants to see these churches thrive and make an impact on the Metro Nashville area.

**Here are some of your NBA Staff's goals for 2017-2018:**

- 1.** Eight new church starts
- 2.** New Revitalizer Pastor's Fellowship meeting bimonthly
- 3.** Vision 20/20 will give us direction as we move to 2020 and beyond.
- 4.** Every NBA church will have a meaningful contact with an NBA staff person.
- 5.** God will help us strengthen our disaster relief ministry by providing individuals to become our team leaders for mud-out/chainsaw and shower trailer units.
- 6.** Twenty NBA churches will share life and ministry with twenty TBMB churches from outside Nashville as a part of City Reach.
- 7.** The NBA Revitalization Team will assist five churches in the revitalization process.
- 8.** The NBA will do everything possible not to lose any more church buildings. The Revitalization Team will be actively connecting churches to help this happen.
- 9.** NBA will host a pastor and wives retreat for renewal and encouragement.
- 10.** We will create an Ethnic Ministry Team representing the 31 ethnic congregations.
- 11.** We will see at least one-half of NBA churches engaged in local ministry projects.
- 12.** The NBA office will be the first and best choice for partnering churches to seek resourcing.
- 13.** Six NBA churches will develop a partnership with a Guatemala City, Guatemala, Baptist church.
- 14.** Forty new people will be trained to teach ESL at their churches.
- 15.** Church members praying for all their neighbors during 2018.

I am thankful to God to serve with you during this time of great challenge and opportunity! I eagerly await to see what God has planned for our ministry in Nashville.

# Church Strengthening Strategist

In my role as Church Strengthening Strategist, I interact with pastors on a variety of needs and opportunities. First and foremost, I desire to add significant value to pastors, staff members, and volunteer leaders as they work to develop, strengthen, and expand their respective ministries. Your NBA staff is committed to strengthening member churches as they carry out the vision God has given them.

In cooperation with the Tennessee Baptist Mission Board and the assistance of the Leadership Development Team, we expanded our faculty for the annual Sunday School Leadership Conference in August to offer more opportunities for church leaders to benefit from focused training on Sunday School and small group ministry. 123 leaders participated in the conference hosted by Tulip Grove Baptist Church. Another major training event is the annual Spanish Speaking Sunday School Leadership Conference. Spanish-speaking Sunday School leaders throughout the Middle Tennessee area came to Hermitage Hills Baptist Church to participate in this year's conference conducted by an extremely effective leadership team.

The Leadership Development Team has met to discuss and plan ways that we can provide significant training to church staff and volunteer leaders. Our goal for 2017-18 is to discover how we can best address your leadership training needs. October will be a month of discovering what pastors and church leaders consider their most pressing leadership development challenges. We also want to discover the most effective methods for delivering leadership training to our church leaders.

Contact us when you have a leadership development need or challenge. We may be able to provide training for your leadership team, or we can direct you to other available training resources. Let's work together to develop the leaders you need to take your church to the next level of growth and significance. Also, if you would like to have a review of your church facility, grounds, we can help you. I interacted with pastors and churches in the Northern and Eastern zones in the following ways:

- Assisted 4 churches in securing pulpit supply during transitional periods.

- Assisted FBC Madison in transition from satellite campus status to reconstituted church.

- Worked with Northwood Baptist Church in connecting with prospective pastor.

- Participated with Neely's Bend Baptist in revitalization process.

- Numerous contacts with pastors and church worship visits.

- Visited 18 Churches and preached in 10 churches

Every church can strengthen its current ministries and programs. Whether you serve in a growing, plateaued, declining, or even dying church, let your NBA team work with you in strengthening your church's vital role in reaching your community for Christ.



# Church Planting Strategist

As I think back over the past year, I'm most struck by the strides we've made in developing a better overall strategy for church planting at the Nashville Baptist Association. A key moment in this strategy development came as I attended the North American Mission Board's Multiply training earlier this year. I heard this statistic: "Church Planters who receive a good assessment, good training, and good coaching have about an 85 percent success rate; however, if any one of these three key ingredients is missing, the success rate drops startlingly to only 35 percent."

Hearing this statistic put into words what I had sensed more peripherally, and it helped us at the association to develop a more thorough plan moving forward. The three elements that absolutely must be present as we support church planters are: 1) quality assessment, 2) up-to-date training, and 3) helpful coaching. Providentially, we were already making strides in all three of these areas. I really do believe that some of our most effective church planting in Nashville is yet to come.

This year we also had six really good church planter fellowships. We averaged around 15-20 planters at each event and had featured speakers that included: Tim Brister, Scott Patty, Russell Moore, Randy C. Davis, Gary Morgan, and Daniel Im. These fellowships continue to provide an opportunity for our planters, their staffs, and those thinking about planting to fellowship and encourage each other while receiving quality equipping.

This year at P2 (Power Plant) we have six different student ministries from around the United States come to partner with six of our church plants. The plants who received help included: New Seasons Church, Grace Story Church, City of Refuge Church, Refuge Church Franklin, Hope Community Church, and All Nations Fellowship. The relationships that are forming between these churches are awesome, and this coming Summer we're helping facilitate some custom mission trips to continue what started this previous year at P2.

Lewis McMullen, Chris Royalty, and I helped lead two different Basic Trainings for Church Planters. Basic Training is typically a Friday/Saturday event where we help new church planters develop their strategies and think through all the aspects that go into planting a health church.

The Nashville Baptist Association currently has five new church plants in development and at different points along the church planting timeline. Finally, I personally had more than 70 meetings with pastors, planters, associational leaders, and others involved with church planting in some aspect.

It was a good year!

This will be my final report for the NBA. I am assuming the pastorate of Liberty Baptist Church in Nashville.

I have enjoyed working with the NBA these last three years. I have seen five language churches join the NBA and have worked with the Nolensville zone and with the revitalization team. I do feel like I need practical hands-on experience with the revitalization of churches. I have been able to visit every church in the Nolensville zone, in addition to visiting and preaching in five language churches and visiting with more than eight language pastors.

During this last year, I preached for three months at Bell Road Baptist Church while they were looking for a pastor and for two months at Liberty Baptist Church after Pastor Josh Lynn suffered an accident that prevented him from continuing as pastor.

Last fall, we took a church visit to California to visit the High Desert Church. One of the pastors who went was Kent Shingleton. Upon returning, he put the OIKOS evangelism strategy into practice at Hope Fellowship Church in Smyrna. The student ministry grew from 25 to 67 in two months, and they baptized 10 people.

Please pray for me as I begin this new chapter in my calling.

## The Church

The definition of a local church, as described in the Baptist Faith and Message is:

A New Testament church of the Lord Jesus Christ is an autonomous local congregation of baptized believers, associated by covenant in the faith and fellowship of the gospel; observing the two ordinances of Christ, governed by His laws, exercising the gifts, rights, and privileges invested in them by His Word, and seeking to extend the gospel to the ends of the earth.

Each congregation operates under the Lordship of Christ through democratic processes. In such a congregation each member is responsible and accountable to Christ as Lord. Its scriptural officers are pastors/elders/overseers and deacons.

Flowing from the definition of a church given above and from the Scriptures from which this definition is derived, we will observe the following guidelines in church planting, leadership training and statistical reporting.

1. A church is intentional about being a church. Members think of themselves as a church. They are committed to one another and to God in pursuing all that Scripture requires of a church.
2. A church has an identifiable membership of baptized believers in Jesus Christ.
3. A church practices the baptism of believers only by immersing them in water.
4. A church observes the Lord's Supper on a regular basis.
5. Under the authority of the local church and its leadership, members may be assigned to carry out the ordinances.
6. A church submits to the inerrant word of God as the ultimate authority for all that it believes and does.
7. A church meets regularly for worship, prayer, the study of God's word, and fellowship. Members of the church minister to one another's needs, hold each other accountable, and exercise church discipline as needed. Members encourage one another and build each other up in holiness, maturity in Christ, and love.
8. A church embraces its responsibility to fulfill the Great Commission, both locally and globally, from the beginning of its existence as a church.
9. A church is autonomous and self-governing under the Lordship of Jesus Christ and the authority of His Word.
10. A church has identifiable leaders, who are scrutinized and set apart according to the qualifications set forth in Scripture. A church recognizes two Biblical offices of church leadership: pastors/elders/overseers and deacons.

## **Nashville Baptist Association (NBA) Church**

1. The church desires to be in fellowship with the NBA and to actively encourage a spirit of cooperative fellowship among the member churches to promote evangelism and discipleship.
2. The church will be in doctrinal unity and integrity as set forth in the Baptist Faith and Message.
3. The church participates in various activities of NBA.
4. The church enlist their membership expertise in service to member churches of the NBA.
5. Each partnering church is to make a regular financial contribution. Member churches of the NBA are encouraged to give at least 3% of undesignated gifts annually.
6. The church is recognized by the NBA by means of information given annually to the NBA by its member churches. The NBA expects the giving of information through the Annual Church Profile.
7. Member churches are encouraged to attend the NBA Annual Meeting each year in September, and quarterly Executive Board meetings.
8. **Voting process.** A Church making application for membership to NBA will meet with a subcommittee of the Missions Team and any representatives of the NBA needed. After a favorable evaluation, the subcommittee will bring a recommendation to the Missions Team for approval of membership. An affirmative vote of the Missions Team will become a recommendation from the Missions Team to the Executive Board of the NBA to be voted on at any regular or annual meeting of the Executive Board.

## **Receiving of Church Planting Funds**

To receive church planting funds, one's activities must be leading to a Nashville Baptist Association church as defined in this document.

**Covenant of Commitment for Application  
into the Nashville Baptist Association**

Member churches will participate in NBA training and fellowship events.

Member churches should practice theology and ministry consistent with the Baptist Faith and Message.

All participating churches and missions who are members of the NBA are encouraged to give at least 3% of undesignated gifts annually to the NBA to assist NBA ministry. Each partnering church is expected to make a financial contribution to the NBA each year, monthly if possible.

Member churches will fill out and return Annual Church Profile to the NBA office no later than November 1 each year. Failure of a church to send a profile two years in succession shall render it subject to review by the Mission Team to determine its status in the association or to offer counsel regarding the preparation of the annual church profile.

Each member church will provide the NBA office with the names, addresses and emails of key leaders who will be sent the Beacon each month.

Member churches will participate in the NBA Annual Meeting each year in September, and quarterly Executive Board meetings.

Each church may be represented at Executive board meetings by the Pastor, a staff member and one lay member or two lay members when a church does not have staff.

NBA staff will meet with church leadership to help them understand the ministry of the Association during the application process for membership.

To become a fully recognized member of the Nashville Baptist Association, your church will approve this document. After review and approval of the Mission Team, the Mission Team will bring your church for approval to the annual meeting or a Quarterly Board meeting.

The LDT is in process of planning the next year in both events and possibly meeting the zones as well. Your suggestions and help in identifying needs are greatly appreciated.

# Revitalization Team

*Bill Blair*

The past year has seen the NBA Church Revitalization Team move from the conceptual to the actual work of helping churches move toward revitalization. During the beginning phases of the CRT, the focus was on definitions and process. After much discussion we landed on an approach that focused not on prescribing a plan but on helping churches discover God's plan for their church. As we focused on this approach, God led us to the following:

**Discovery Process:** The CRT developed a process to help churches discover God's plan for them. The process involves members from the CRT walking with leaders of churches helping them to evaluate their congregation, the community, and church organization. As the church is evaluated, the CRT helps lead the church and its leaders to focus on prayer as they seek God's will for their church. This discovery process can be adapted for churches that have pastors as well as those without. The CRT began utilizing this process with churches this year.

**NAMB Replant Partnership:** Early in the year the NBA CRT connected with the revitalization leaders from NAMB in order to learn more about their Replant process. According to NAMB, a replant can come in many forms, but the focus is on renewing the work and vision of churches that are on a course toward eventual death. Most often these churches give up some degree of control to a leadership team, the association, or partnering church in order to receive greater help and make the necessary changes so the church can replant itself in the community where it already resides. NAMB has even developed a specific assessment process to evaluate pastors who feel led to this type of work. With help from NAMB, the NBA began a replant process with a church as they are seeking to call an assessed replanting pastor. If you believe your church is moving toward eventual death, please contact the CRT and we can help you examine the options available for replanting your church in your community so your church might continue its ministry for years to come.

# Church Planting Team

Team Leader: *Michael Cunningham*

2016-2017 proved to be an exciting year for the Nashville Baptist Association's Church Planting Team.

Fellowships for planters expanded in quality and scope with speakers like Daniel Im, Lifeway; Randy Davis, Executive Director, TBMB; and Russell Moore, ERLC. Attendance continued to expand and the fellowships provided a valuable time of networking, training and support for planters. Trainings also went well. Boot Camp saw 20 participants and Lewis McMullen provided the Churches Planting Churches training for sending churches.

The most exciting development of 2017 was the possibility of expanding the association's ability to assess and place church planters. A group that included myself, Rusty Sumrall, JoAnne Howard, Lewis McMullen, and Ben Adkison attended the "White Label Assessment Training" at the North American Mission Board, March 13-14, 2017. This training would allow the NBA to replicate the same process that the North American Mission Board uses to deploy hundreds of planters annually as part of the SEND North American campaign. As Nashville continues to grow and diversify, the association is evaluating how this tool could be used to accommodate the growing demand for planters.

The Church Planting team is also pleased to welcome Gary Morgan as the new City Reach Coordinator for Nashville. City Reach is a partnership between the Tennessee Baptist Mission Board and the Nashville Baptist Association to mobilize groups from through our state to saturate Nashville with the gospel. Gary brings a wealth of experience as pastor of Mosaic, Nashville. This partnership offers tremendous potential for our planters to receive help and support from Tennessee churches.

Ben Adkison provided leadership and expertise in his role as Church Planting Strategist for our association. His report details the new churches planted in Nashville last year and his vision going into 2018. His commitment to excellence allows him to fulfill the association's need for new plants without compromising quality. This commitment results in church plants with a greater chance for success.

It is my pleasure to serve an association that is committed to reaching Nashville with the gospel. The Church Planting Team continues to make strides, and we look forward to seeing what opportunities 2018 will bring.



# 2016 Toy Store

The NBA Toy Store 2016 was another tremendous success, and Christmas was merrier for the **344 families (930 children)** who were served through Toy Store ministry.

Local churches, businesses, schools, and individuals provided 3,500 gifts. Each child received at least three toys. **142 bicycles** were donated and distributed, and more than **5,000 stocking stuffers** were given away. Families received candy, wrapping paper, and the choice of a food item (rice or beans). Clothing items were also included for children ages infant to 11. Seven people committed their lives to Christ!

# P2 Missions 2017



This year's P2 was a continuation of the awesome ministry that has characterized this event year after year. P2 is a camp/mission experience originally designed by the North American Mission Board. It partners student ministries from around the country with church planters for a one week mission experience.

In Nashville this year we had six different student ministries partner with six different church plants within our city. The church plants involved included:

- New Church
- New Season Church
- City of Refuge Church
- Refuge Church Franklin
- All Nations Fellowship
- Hope Community Church



For P2, each church planter helps determine the scope of ministry that takes place during the week based on the needs and strategy of the church he is planting. This means that some plants utilize backyard bible clubs, some do light construction, some canvas neighborhoods, some put on block parties or free car washes, etc.

P2 has proved to be a great event for churches and church planters year after year. In some cases, it helps foster significant partnership and ministry for many years between the people and churches involved.

This event also typically involves a host church who lets all the students sleep on its floors, utilize its fellowship hall, and provides a venue for worship each night. This year we were privileged to be hosted by Haywood Hills Baptist Church. They did a fantastic job of making us feel welcome all week long.

The final statistics for this year in Nashville were:

- 6 church plants involved
- 6 student ministries involved
- 1 host church involved
- 99 presentations of the gospel
- 4 professions of faith in the gospel

**13** Nashville Baptist churches provided lunches each day for World Changers crews.



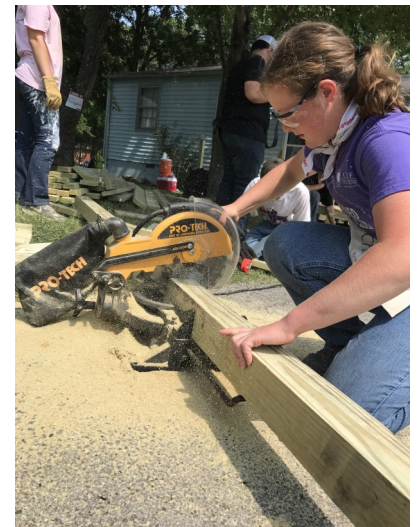
Additional work sites included a ministry for at-risk youth, a low-income apartment complex, and an apartment building for elderly and disabled people.

# WMU

NBA WMU has had an exciting year serving the local churches to help them realize their potential. Our theme for 2016-2018 has been By All Means. Paul wrote in 1 Corinthians 9:22b-23 (NIV), "I have become all things to all people so that by all possible means I might save some. I do this for the sake of the gospel, that I may share in its blessings." In Colossians he exhorts us to be wise in how we treat outsiders.

In October we served through JAM, a one-day children's event in which children learn about missions in fun and exciting ways.

Baptist Women's World Day of Prayer was held at Harpeth Hills Baptist Church in November. 84 women and men gathered to learn about what women around the world are doing to make a difference in the lives of women and children including the Middle Tennessee area with a word from Becky Sumrall, Executive Director of Begin Anew and Elaine Pearson (Wilson County), Phoebe Ministries. # Royal Ambassador Leadership

This has been a challenging year for Royal Ambassadors in Nashville. NBA RA groups are making their presence known in Tennessee with some of the strongest RA ministries in the state.

The challenge came with our major event for the year, the Annual Royal Ambassador Wilderness Challenge, a camping event that features Christian speakers and missionaries for worship, Royal Racers (pinewood derby races) and the Campcraft Rodeo. It has become the second largest event for RAs in Tennessee and is recognized as one of the best events in the nation. With Easter falling on our normal weekend for RAWC, we moved it to the next week, which created challenges with Boxwell Reservation. They moved us to a new camping area that normally would not have been a problem, but the weather had other ideas. Heavy rainfall was forecast for the area throughout the weekend with a strong possibility of severe weather, including tornados. As a result, we did something that we have never considered before and cancelled Wilderness Challenge. The weather forecast was accurate, as heavy rain started at noon and continued until Sunday afternoon. Our motto has been "Don't Complain, Camp in the Rain," but without a suitable storm shelter, it was the right choice. We had hoped to reschedule the event, but locations and dates were not feasible. The next Wilderness Challenge is scheduled to take place April 12-15, 2018.

With the impact of Hurricanes Harvey and Irma, the RA Lead Team is investigating the possibility of an association-wide fundraiser for disaster relief this fall. This likely will be a Basketball Dribble-Thon and Shootout as a kick-off event to basketball season as well as earmarking funds for this year's RAWC Mission Hike to benefit NBA disaster relief units.

We hope churches will embrace the view that RA ministries, if done properly, can bring people into the church. More importantly, we want churches to see how the skills we teach in RAs are vital to Christ's challenge to take the gospel to the ends of the earth. If an RA becomes a missionary, he will have the basic skills he needs to forge ahead in his journey. He will know how to build a fire, use a compass, tell a Bible story accurately, and know the importance of that calling on our lives. If your church does not have RAs and GAs, how will they know the importance and have the skills to reach the lost? I challenge you to consider having a dedicated missions education program of RAs, Gas, or Children in Action and begin preparing tomorrow's missionaries today! For more information on starting or strengthening this ministry in your church, contact me, and I will be happy to walk you through what you need to do and make sure you have the training you need to be successful and to build a foundation for the future.

The NBA WMU Team hosted RA and Challenger Training on September 9 this year at Bellevue Baptist Church. The TBMB continues to partner with us, providing promotions and other support resources as needed.

Tennessee RAs Lead Team has put together four training models and consulting services for individual churches that need training. RA Trainers train church leaders, then walk with them to coach and help them throughout the year. RA Express is a two-hour training, designed for individual churches and for associational and regional mission trainings, that highlights important components of RAs and gives leaders the basic tools they need to lead RAs at their churches. RA Academy is a four-hour immersive training that delves into all aspects of RAs (missions ed, campcraft, racers, etc.) to help leaders strengthen their RA ministry. RA University is a two-day, eight- to ten-hour training that dives deep into RA leadership. Leaders learn best practices for chapter meetings, teaching campcraft to boys, preparing events to engage RAs and draw new members in, and how to do advancement and interest activities for boys. This training teaches leaders how boys learn and helps them to better manage the classroom in order to effectively reach boys. This is one of the most successful events we offer in Tennessee and is a great opportunity to take RAs into the community for Christ! Tennessee is leading the way in training nationally, and we are proud to be a part of that!

We covet your prayers for RAs as we continue to reach boys for Christ. Be in prayer for the boys of Nashville as they learn to be Ambassadors for Christ. Pray for godly men and women who will serve as leaders and show the love of Christ to every boy who comes through the door. Finally, be in prayer for 2018 dates for RAs in Nashville.

## 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Ministry Celebration

Begin Anew is celebrating our 20<sup>th</sup> year by expanding the ministry. First, student enrollment increased from twelve men to twenty-nine men in the Madison Begin Anew ministry. Second, in January 2017 we began ministering to immigrants and refugees in a new satellite location in South Nashville. Finally, February 2017 we began serving families previously resettled and served by World Relief. God has called us to share Jesus with these families and individuals He has bought to Nashville from all over the world! As we share the Gospel with them, they are able to overcome spiritual, mental, emotional, and physical obstacles caused by poverty. Christ Church, Tusculum Hills Baptist Church, and Nashville First Baptist Church are our partners in the expansion of the ministry.

Since 1997, Begin Anew has expanded throughout middle TN from one to seven ministry locations where we serve over 250 adults and 150 + children each week. Only God alone could have imagined all that would take place between now and 1997 when a small group of Ladies of Nashville Baptist Association's (NBA) Women's Missionary Union (WMU) Associational Council and NBA opened their hearts and hands and found a way to help the women of Middle TN. Thank you NBA for being our first ministry partner in 1997!

Weekly, the ministry serves women, men, and their children who seek to attain their high school equivalency, further their knowledge of computer and job skills, and learn English. However, the foundation of the ministry is to lead them to being or grow in a personal relationship with Christ. This is accomplished through weekly Bible study, prayer partners, encouragers, tutors, teachers, childcare workers, those who serve meals, and the many more beloved volunteers. Free childcare removes an additional barrier and peace of mind for students while they are in their classes.



Pictured is the Emmanuel family. They are from the Republic of the Congo and have been in the United States since November 2016. They are the first family from World Relief to come under the care of Begin Anew's new South Nashville site with a Good Neighbor Team. This family of nine has two teenagers, two young children, two toddlers and one infant named Mercy Lillian. They have a wonderful Good Neighbor team and love going to church and learning about God. Though there is a language barrier, going to church each Sunday is one of their main goals.

Often I will hear one of the teenagers say, “In America, this is how it is done”, or “In America, they don’t do this or they don’t do that.” Recently their son Jean Amani said, “Americans don’t sleep late, they get up early to go to work.” When I hear this, I’m amazed of the things we don’t think about on a daily basis because they are the norm for us as Americans. Pray for God to call more Christians to join us as a Good Neighbor Team (4 -6 people) with other refugee families.

# Guatemala Partnership

In 2017, the NBA Executive Board approved a recommendation from the Missions Team to develop a partnership with Baptist churches in Guatemala City, Guatemala.

The NBA provided \$900 assistance each to nine people from seven NBA churches to participate in a vision tour to six different churches in Guatemala City from August 14-18, 2017.

The Vision Team was challenged by the needs and the ministry of the Guatemala City Churches.

We need partners for each of the churches in the city. We need at least six partner churches now and could grow to six more churches in 2018.

Your Missions Team hopes to sponsor an NBA mission trip to Guatemala City during 2018.

Some of the needs of the six churches are:

1. Construction work — adding on to existing church buildings
2. Ministries in schools
3. Ministry to children
4. Medical clinics
5. Evangelistic visitation
6. Support and participation in weekday ministries of the churches

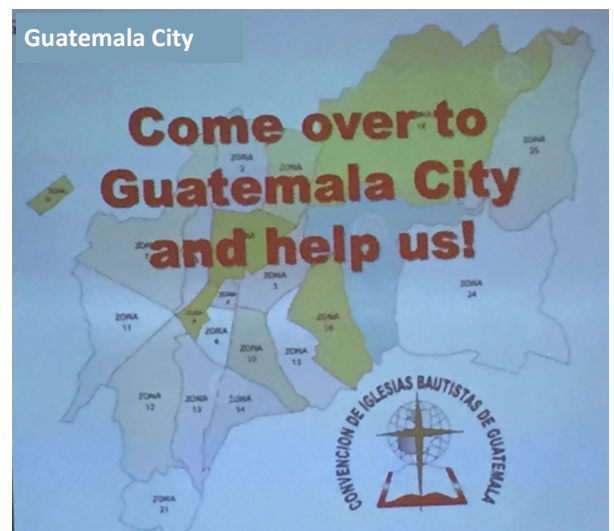
